



INFORMATION FOR SUMMER PARTICIPANTS LIVING ON CAMPUS

The policy information listed below is relevant to your residency in a Notre Dame residence hall during the summer. For more information or clarification on these and other responsibilities, please refer to any residence hall staff member or to the Office of Residential Life at summer@nd.edu or 574-631-5878.

Community is defined as a unified body of individuals. Notre Dame's residential community, an integral part of our mission, encourages a way of living exemplifying Christian community and endeavors to develop that sense of community that prepares individuals to build a world that is more human and more divine. We encourage participants to build community by interacting with others in a positive, supportive manner and by adhering to all policies and procedures outlined below.

ALCOHOL, DRUGS & GATHERINGS

The use of alcohol is only permitted for those individuals of legal age in the state of Indiana. For those individuals, the use of alcohol is only permitted in private rooms and is not to be carried in open containers throughout the hall or campus. Within Notre Dame residence halls, the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages that contain in excess of fourteen percent (14%) alcohol by volume is prohibited and applies to all participants and their guests, regardless of age. Parties and large gatherings are not permitted in participant rooms at any time. The use of illegal drugs or abuse of prescribed medication is prohibited by the university.

CURFEW, PARIETALS AND VISITATION

All curfew, visitation, and parietal policies shall be upheld by every summer participant. Policies are as follows based on the type of residence hall occupied.

Adult: Guests may not enter any hall except the one to which they are assigned. Graduate, undergraduate, high school, or minors under the age of 18 are prohibited from visiting conference halls.

Graduate: Visitation is limited to 9:00 AM - Midnight. Overnight visitation is not permitted regardless of gender. Conference guests, undergraduate, high school, or minors under the age of 18 are prohibited from visiting graduate halls and graduate students are prohibited from entering other halls

Undergraduate: Visitation is limited to 9:00 AM - Midnight. Overnight visitation is not permitted regardless of gender. Conference guests, graduate students, high school students, or minors under the age of 18 are prohibited from visiting these halls and undergraduate students are prohibited from entering other halls.

High School (non-Sports Camp groups): Guests may not enter any hall except the one to which they are assigned, nor may they have visitors. All guests must be in their assigned hall by 11:00 PM Sun - Thurs and 12:00 AM Fri - Sat. Guests must be in their assigned rooms by 12:30 AM each night.

Sports Camps: Guests may not enter any hall except the one to which they are assigned, nor may they have visitors. All guests must be in their assigned hall by 11:00 PM and in their assigned rooms by 11:30 PM each night.

DAMAGE AND DECORATIONS

Any damage to a residence hall room or common spaces or its furnishings will be charged to the occupants of the room or the occupants responsible for the damage. All residence hall rooms, hallways, and common areas are inventoried prior to move in and will be inventoried upon departure. Decoration of rooms that does not cause damage is allowed. Do not decorate door frames, doors, floors, hallways or walls using paint, stickers, tape or any other products that would cause marring, chipping, holes or other damage. The application of shaving cream, soap, streamers, contact paper, other damaging materials or extraneous decorations to residence hall facilities is prohibited.

ELEVATORS

Playing on elevators is prohibited, and will result in a fine. The maximum number of persons on one elevator at one time is listed in or by the elevator. Overloading the elevators can cause them to break down, which can lead to guests being stuck inside them until repairs can be made by a certified technician.

FIRE SAFETY/FIRE ALARM SYSTEMS/SMOKING

Fire alarm systems and other fire equipment such as smoke detectors, portable fire extinguishers and sprinkler systems are installed in buildings for safety and protection of all residents. Malicious tampering with or misuse of these devices and system components will result in severe disciplinary action including removal of all persons involved from residence. Smoking is prohibited in all areas of the residence halls or within 25 feet of any campus building. In addition, burning incense or candles is not permitted.

FIREWORKS AND WEAPONS

The possession or use of any form of fireworks or weapons is prohibited. A student using or possessing any form of fireworks or weapons will be removed from the residence hall and face disciplinary action.

KEYS

Keys are each resident's responsibility. Lost keys must be reported immediately to the hall staff. Lost keys will result in a \$100 re-coring fee. Assistance with "lock outs" can be provided by the residence hall staff, but chronic lockouts may result in a fine.

QUIET HOURS/NOISE LEVELS/HALLWAYS

Each guest has a right to a quiet atmosphere beginning at 10:00 p.m. every evening and ending at 9:00 a.m. the next morning. Quiet hours are violated by such activities as shouting, yelling or talking on cell phones in the hallways, a gathering of residents in a room that can be heard in the hallway, playing loud TV's or music, and any other activity that disturbs others. Residents should be courteous of each other's needs and must immediately cease any noise or activity that is disturbing someone else regardless of the time. Athletic activity of any kind (basketball, golf, soccer, volleyball, wrestling, Frisbee throwing, rollerblading, hockey, etc.) is absolutely prohibited in the corridors/hallways regardless of time.

REFRIGERATORS AND ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES

The University discourages the proliferation of electrical appliances in residents' rooms. Refrigerators in resident rooms must not exceed 5.0 cubic feet in size and must be in good operating condition. The use of the following electrical appliances is prohibited in all residence halls: air conditioners, broilers, rotisseries, ceiling fans, skillets, rice cookers, dimmer switches, hot plates, microwaves, toaster ovens, hot pots, toasters, and other such high-wattage and heating appliances. The use, possession or storage of electronic skateboards including self-balancing boards/scooters and other similar equipment is prohibited in residence halls.

ROOF AND LEDGE AREAS/WINDOWS

For your personal safety and the safety of others, access to roof and ledge areas is prohibited. Window screens must remain in place at all times to help control insects and to prevent accidents. Throwing anything from windows is strictly prohibited. Participants will be held responsible for personal injuries, property damage and cleaning charges that result from this action.

ROOM ENTRY

The University reserves the right to enter rooms without a search warrant for purpose of maintenance, security, discipline, and the orderly operation of an educational institution.

PETS/ANIMALS

The only animals permitted in residence halls are service animals or University approved Emotional Support Animals. Should you have questions regarding these types of animals, contact Sara Bea Disability Services at 574-631-7157.

THEFT/VANDALISM

Any theft, unauthorized possession or damage to property is prohibited, and will result in a fine. Guests vandalizing University or another's property will be removed from the residence hall.

VIOLATION OF POLICIES/PERSONAL CONDUCT

Notre Dame is a Catholic university and expects individuals to exemplify the standards of Christian morality while on campus. Any activity which offends these standards may lead to removal from the residence hall. The University reserves the right to remove any guest for violation of any University Policy. Deposits may be subject to forfeiture and/or any account balances may be subject to immediate payment.
